

Orthopaedic Surgery - Curriculum

Each rotation is tailored for the resident's level of training. The PGY2-PGY5 rotations consist of 10-week blocks. They allow the resident to get an in-depth approach to different subspecialties. The length of the rotations allow both residents and attendings to become comfortable with each other's learning and teaching styles as well as give residents the opportunity to have increased surgical participation and autonomy.
